Arctic ice, endangered forests, her local landscape or the effects of climate change on our environment, this lecture will show her journey from inspiration to final textile work.

### Being T(here)

India Flint

Explorers and researchers prided themselves on classifying, quantifying and naming the places, creatures and plants they encountered. A wondering wanderer takes a gentler approach, respectfully noting sounds, the kiss of the breeze, the scents carried on it and the terrain under their feet. Paying attention to the sky, the passing river and encounters with falling leaves. India's work conflates the visual and written poetics of place and memory, using walking, drawing, assemblage, mending, stitch, image-making and text as a means of mapping country, recoding and recording responses to landscape – working with cloth, paper, stone, windfall biological material, water, minerals, bones, the discarded artefacts and hard detritus of human habitation, the local weed burden. "I negotiate a path between installation, printing, painting, drawing, writing and sculpture. The work of each day, philosophically rooted in topophilia (the love of place) literally begins with a walk. In this lecture I will share stories and images of my responses to place... as well as the unrolling of a bundle" said India.

### Birds and Feathers

Sheena Norquay

This powerpoint presentation is about work inspired by seabirds and by Sheena's late father's peacock. She will explain how she designed samples and selected thread colours for the Seabird and Peacock thread collections for Aurifil. Machine and hand applique, embroidery and quilting techniques which were used in creating the pieces will be illustrated as well as techniques used for painting, printing and stenciling some of them. You will see lots of ideas in this presentation so hope you will be inspired and learn something new.

### Bojagi: Korean Wrapping Cloths & Contemporary Makers

For centuries textiles were one of the few ways Korean women could express their creativity. Until the 1950s they were used to wrap, carry or cover everything from bedding and clothes to food dishes and for religious rituals. Different seams were traditionally used to join together ramie, hemp and silk organza fabrics into these beautiful often translucent cloths. The designs and symbolism in Bojagi now inspire many textile artists around the world. You will see how bojagi has been reinterpreted in many different ways including in mixed media and temporary land art.

### Bojagi: The Art of Wrapping Cloths

Youngmin Lee, USA

Bojagi, the art of Korean wrapping cloths, embodies the philosophy of recycling, as the cloths are made from remnants of leftover fabric. It also carries wishes for the well-being and happiness of its recipients. It is also strikingly contemporary: the designs and colours of bojagi remind one of the works of modern abstract artists. Bojagi can be described as a true form of abstract expressionism. Youngmin Lee will talk about history, culture and interesting details of bojagi during this lecture.

### Creative Stitched Textiles

Wendy Dolan

In this illustrated talk, Wendy will explore the exciting world of stitched textiles. An experienced artist, tutor, and author she will share her techniques of layering, painting and stitching, encouraging you to experiment at home. Considering where ideas come from and the importance of design she will guide you through the creative process. Textured surfaces can be created using a combination of techniques. Layers of natural fabrics – cotton, calico, scrim, muslin, silk, batting etc. can be applied and then worked into with freehand machine and hand stitching. Cable stitch and whip stitch, using thicker yarns on the machine and altering tensions can add to the surface textures, along with the application of three dimensional fabric mediums. These textured surfaces can then be painted with fabric paint before embellishing the surface with coloured threads. The talk will be illustrated with examples of the many ways these techniques can be applied, from pictures, wall hangings and quilts to wedding garments and large commissioned stage curtains. Wendy is the author of Search Press’s bestselling publication Layer, Paint and Stitch which gives an in depth exploration of these exciting textile techniques.

You will discover the tips for cutting, pressing and stitching that will help you to get better results in all your machine-stitched patchwork, including how to achieve perfect points!

### Layer Paint and Stitch

Wendy Dolan

Wendy will share her exciting world of stitched textiles in this demonstration. An experienced artist, tutor, and author she will show her techniques of layering, painting and stitching, encouraging you to experiment at home. Inspired by the landscape and working from a photograph and sketch, a variety of natural fabrics, calico, silk noil, scrim, cotton batting, will be layered to create a textured surface. This will then be worked into with freehand machine stitching. Three

dimensional fabric mediums will be applied before painting the textured surface with water based fabric paints. Freehand machine stitching will then be added using coloured machine threads to emphasise the design details and add to the surface texture. Wendy is the author of Search Press’s bestselling publication Layer, Paint and Stitch which gives an in depth exploration of these exciting textile techniques. Wendy will have samples of each developmental stage to show as she demonstrates the different techniques so the full process can be appreciated. Additional techniques such as cable stitch, using thicker yarn in the bobbin of the machine will be explained.

### Lights, Darks & Shades of Nature

Join Pat for this demonstration of just how easy it is to paint Lutradur (a spun bonded textile) to produce a realistic figure from a photograph that can then be applied to a fabric background. He’ll reflect on over forty years of studio production and the quality of creative life it brought him.

### Mariners Compass Conquered: No Foundation or PP

You can move Mariner’s Compass to the top of your “bucket list” with the From Marti Michell Mariner’s Compass template sets, available in two sizes – 14” finished circle on 18” block or 20” circle on 24” block. Each set contains 6 acrylic pieces carefully designed for you to easily make 16 point, 32 point, split points, halos and fussy cut variations of

Mariner’s Compass. All of the variations will be demonstrated and are created as part of the cutting process. The basic “no Y-seams”, no paper-piecing unit is the same regardless of the variation. Marti will also demonstrate her reverse applique finishing technique.

### Marti’s Stash Buster Hit Parade of Quilts

If you love machine-piecing quilts, you’ll really enjoy Marti’s stash-buster trunk show. It both celebrates and simplifies making patchwork quilts. Get inspired with 30 or more quilts in 45 minutes. Finally, the presentation will turn to elements of composition to include line, balance, contrast, and repetition, and will conclude with a question and answer session as time allows.

Whether you are on a domestic or longarm – Quilting can be a real pain in the neck. Rose has been

sewing for 40 years, quilting for 30 and a Personal Trainer since 1995. In addition she holds certifications in Ergonomics, Nutrition, Arthritis and Older Adult Training. Healthy quilting includes: the ergonomics of sewing, pressing, cutting, FMQ and longarm quilting, as well as stretches designed for quilters’ neck, sore shoulders, lower backache and carpal tunnel syndrome prevention. We’ll also look at the importance of hydration and movement and other tips so we can all sew smart, to sew long.

Cathy’s father was a leather tooler

and carver. She inherited his tools but soon realized she quilted much better than she tooled leather, so she set out to create the illusion of tooled leather using quilting and dyes. In this lecture, Cathy steps you through her 'thread tooling' process from quilting to dying and shows you how she's used this technique to create beautiful pieces of art.

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### Urban Textures

Eszter Bornemisza is a fiber artist living in Budapest, Hungary working with recycled paper, textiles and other found soft materials. The basic process of her creation is machine stitching, with additional elements of printing, dyeing and painting. Having made art quilts for more than ten years, her interest has turned to creating transparent wall-hangings, objects and installations using ripped, overprinted newspaper. Join her as she talks about, her inspirations, the stories behind them and her technical experiments "The theme of my work revolves around ideas that reflect our relationship with urban life. The fragmented, distorted or disintegrated city plans are used as imprints of our systematized living. Like labyrinths they offer rich ground for associations, deepening our understanding of urban life," Eszter said. Her work also addresses issues related to past and present cultures of a place: its layers of existence. Imprints of ages in the ground and in our minds; traces and their meanings for us; and all of their personal and social narratives are in the focus of her interest.
